**Unsafe medication practices** and **medication errors** are leading causes of avoidable harm in health care across the world. Medication errors occur when weak medication systems, and human factors such as fatigue, poor environmental conditions, or staff shortages, affect prescribing, transcribing, dispensing, administration, and monitoring practices, which can then result in severe patient harm, disability, and even death. The ongoing COVID-19 pandemic has significantly exacerbated the risk of medication errors and associated medication-related harm.

To commemorate the day by following this year's theme of "Medication Without Harm" by WHO, the **Patient Academy for Innovation and Research (PAIR)** in partnership with the **Organisation of Pharmaceutical Producers of India (OPPI)** and **Dakshayani and Amaravati Health and Education (DakshamA Health)** is organizing the **World Patient Safety Day 2022** with the theme "*Role of stakeholders in GPSAP in the country context to ensure medication safety*" that will bring all the stakeholders to discuss their roles in ensuring medication safety and reducing medication-related harm through strengthening systems and practices of medication use, making the process of medication safer and free from harm, and galvanizing action on the Challenge by calling on all stakeholders to prioritize medication safety and address unsafe practices and system weaknesses.
